## ELECTRICITY TARIFFS FOR THE PERIOD 01 JULY 2018 – 30 JUNE 2019

Your application dated 30 May 2018 refers.

The Energy Regulator at its meeting held on 25 April 2018 approved the guideline increase of 6.84% for municipalities applicable for 2018/19 financial year. Consequently, the Energy Regulator considered your application for a tariff increase for the period 01 July 2018 - 30 June 2019 and approved the tariffs as follows:

### 1. Domestic Tariffs

#### 1.1 Domestic Pre-paid Indigent

Tariff blocks	c/kWh
Block 1 (0 - 50)kWh	91.08
Block 2 (51 - 350)kWh	112.30
Block 3 (351 - 600 )kWh	158.84



## 1.2 Domestic Pre-paid & Conventional

Tariff Blocks	c/kWh
Block 1 (0 - 50 )kWh	91.44
Block 2 (51 - 350)kWh	117.56
Block 3 (351 - 600)kWh	163.10
Block 4 (> 600)kWh	194.73

## 2. Commercial Tariffs

### 2.1 Commercial

- Basic Charge: R 921.09 /month
- Energy charge: 141.11 c/kWh

## 3. Industrial Tariff

- Basic Charge: R 5 011.48 /month
- Energy charge: 89.76 c/kWh
- Demand charges: R 199.32 /kVA

The Energy Regulator further directs as follows the municipality:


- Must increase the repairs and maintenance expenditure to 6% of the total revenue generated from the sale of electricity; and
- must submit a report on a quarterly basis commencing 30 September 2018 in order to enable NERSA to closely monitor the energy losses.

Please note that in terms of the National Energy Regulator Act, 2004(Act No.40 of 2004), National Energy Regulator is entrusted to perform all the functions that the National Electricity Regulator used to perform, and amongst others, to review and approve tariff increase proposals by all licensed distributors of electricity in South Africa. Implementation of tariffs without approval of the Energy Regulator is a contravention of the license conditions issued to you.
